Each field of the Academy will run after school sessions every week.

Attendance is compulsory and will be treated as Period 7 of the school day.

Secondary students enrolled in the Arts Academy are expected to be enrolled in the relevant in-school subjects. Students will be assessed in these classes and results will appear in their school report.

Musical Theatre

The Musical Theatre field of the Arts Academy combines Music, Dance and Drama to provide skills in presenting musical theatre productions.

The program is made up of 2 after school sessions per week on Monday and Thursday from 3:10-4pm.

One session is focused on music aural and singing skills and the other is aimed at developing performance skills through acting and dance.



As performance is a key aspect of this program, Academy students are expected to participate in the biennial School musical and Performing Arts Showcase.

Other performance opportunities may also be scheduled throughout the year to showcase the learning of the Academy program. Schedules outlining any additional after school and weekend rehearsals will be distributed to families to plan around these times.

Musical Theatre Academy students are also strongly encouraged to participate in the music tuition program during school time in either instrumental or singing lessons.

Visual & Digital Arts

The **Year 5 -9 Visual & Digital Art program** within the Academy will allow students to develop and extend their skills in visual enquiry and engage in new skills and mediums within the areas of clay, drawing, printing, painting, photography and digital media.

The focus of this program is developing and building on a student's foundation skills to complete refined and well-developed finished pieces.

They will be given the opportunity to display their work in an exhibition style setting and participate in various excursions that will help support their learning in class.



The **Year 10-12 program** is designed to help develop a student's own studio work. Teachers are facilitators to assist in developing a student's own arts practice.

Students will engage in critical thinking skills by visiting and engaging in work in exhibitions and gallery settings and will have the opportunity to focus on developing their own practise in the mediums of photography, print, drawing, digital art, painting and clay.



The Visual & Digital Arts program consists of a weekly session which is run on a Wednesday afternoon from 3:10-4:30pm. Senior Academy students will have extended workshop hours to 5pm some weeks.
