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Overview

2019 was the first year of operation as Court Grammar School, previously known as Serpentine Jarrahdale Grammar School, which was the name registered on 11 October 2004 by a group of local residents determined to have a school available in the Serpentine Jarrahdale Shire. The School commenced operation with 47 students in February 2006 in the old Mundijong Shire offices. The School flourished from the start as enrolments grew to over 250 by the commencement of the 2009 school year.

The School was fortunate to receive a gift of land from the Bett family located on the corner of Bishop and Soldiers Roads in 2008 and the first build on the site was completed in 2009. A second build was undertaken in 2011 and further buildings commenced in 2015/6. In 2016, the School became the first Pre-Kindergarten to Year 12 school in the area.

The Principal is responsible for the operation of the School, reporting to an independently constituted Board. The School's motto is Integrity, Humility, Community expressed through a RESPECT ethos.

These are articulated as:

- Respect for God
- Respect for Self
- Respect for Others
- · Respect for Learning
- Respect for the Environment

The School's learning environment is based on the partnership between parents, teachers and students. Court Grammar School students have opportunities to explore a wide variety of learning endeavours including sporting, academic and cultural activities while a focused core curriculum emphasises literacy and numeracy skills. The whole person is encouraged to grow through a strong and developing pastoral care system and a strong and developing sense of belonging within the School community.

The Primary School practices a nature based pedagogy and this is reflected in the set up of their classrooms.

The School has an AFL/W Academy, whereby selected students are exposed to professional coaches, athletes and resources during school contact time to excel in the learning of our great Australian game.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL - OUR YEAR TO HONOUR INTEGRITY

2019 was the second year in which we explored our three core values within our crest, Integrity, Humility and Community. This year we honoured Integrity, which was pertinent as it was also the first year we operated under the name Court Grammar School. Mr Andrew Hastie spoke of Sir Charles Court's integrity at the Sir Charles Court Futures' Assembly. Indeed, he was a man who acted with integrity in everything he did.

2019 saw our double stream Kindergarten classes full and a waitlist commenced for the first time in our School's history. Next year will see the expansion of our Primary to be fully double stream from K to Year 6, enabling sustainable growth in our secondary school.

We undertook refurbishment of the senior classrooms with desks and carpets, new carpet in the year 6 classrooms and the installation of stage curtains in the gym. Our Music Centre became operational whereby purpose built music rooms are utilised for the ever growing peripatetic music programme. Planning is underway for a new Art facility which will provide state of the art facilities for Art, Graphics, Drama, Dance and Information Technology.

We continue to provide an extensive co-curricular program including our Police Rangers.

Our fabulous community came together with our Outdoor Movie Night where we enjoyed "Paddington Bear".

We introduced the awarding of Respect Bears for our sporting carnivals, whereby the Respect Bear is awarded to the house that displays the most respect and positive sportsmanship throughout the day. The inaugural winners were Whitby. An individual bear is presented to the student who displays outstanding sportsmanship at the event.


2019 was the year of the first student musical - Shrek Jnr - which was performed over 4 nights to rave reviews. A truly wonderful whole community event.

Our School is justly proud of our students who attended the Anglicare sleep out. We were delighted to appoint some of them as Ambassadors for the programme. We continue to reap the benefits of the Sr Eileen Heath scholarships from the Anglican Community Fund.

Our Arts programme continued to flourish. The Music Department held their Annual Spotlight on Students concert with over 50 students ranging from Years 2 to 11, who were selected by their Instrumental Tutors performing pieces that they had been working on. A group of drama students again performed in the annual YOH - Youth on Health Festival and received multiple merit awards on the night. I cannot wait to see how these students develop when their new purpose built Arts Centre opens in 2020.


Non-Attendance Management




If a student's attendance falls below 90% or has been identified as being "at risk" intervention strategies are put in place by the School.












Please Note: The National, State, Similar and Court Grammar School Cohort Mean scores are shown.



WACE Achievement

In 2019, Court Grammar School had 26 students enrolled in Year 12, at the completion of the year all students met the graduation requirements and achieved their WACE certificate.

61% of the students achieved an ATAR score


47% of the students achieved a Certificate

Due to 8% of our students achieving both an ATAR score and a Certificate the above numbers add to more than 100%.

University of Notre Dame










